Paris 2018, Gay Games 10

"The Gay Games 10 Dancesport Experience" by Horace Luong, NASSPDA Board Member

Gay Games 10 was held between August 4-12 in Paris, France. There were over 10,300 participants registered for these games, Dancesport being one. The Games started off with the Opening Ceremonies in the Paris stadium, Stade Jean Bouin, where the countries paraded in followed by entertainment (video). Of note is the participation from countries where homosexuality is illegal.



The Gay Games 10 and IFSSDA World Championship Dancesport event was held at Gymnase Japy, which was built in 1870, initially as a covered market and then later in the mid-1880s it was converted into a gymnasium. Paris was hit by scorching temperatures during the first day of the event and lacking air conditioning (or air movement for that matter) at this older venue, seeing who can stay in their standard costumes the longest under the hot environment should have been a sport in itself. The competition ran from August 7 to 10 for about 10-12 hours a day and was hosted by two masters of ceremonies - Peter Meager (English speaker) and Tony Marcireau (French speaker), both of whom did a wonderful job keeping events moving and entertaining the audience.



There were 13 judges for this Dancesport competition, two of whom from North America - Benjamin Soencksen and Wendy Johnson. Over the first three days of the competition we cheered for those in the Standard, Latin, 10-dance, and Argentine Tango divisions. There was a range of skill levels on the dancefloor, and it was amazing to see how many and the high caliber of the A-level dancers - there were quarter finals for this class! On the last day, was the overly entertaining Showdance competition where several teams and couples were competing. There was also a Handi-dance Showdance competition (wheelchair dancing) this year where the top couple was truly a crowd-pleaser with their skills and enthusiasm! With over 360 Dancesport competitors from all around the world, there was a strong contingency of NASSPDA members. In the evening on the last day, all winners of the high level divisions gave a short presentation of their dancing at the gala followed by social dancing late in the evening.

Based on what we saw in Paris, we better start training now for Gay Games 11 in Hong Kong 2022.

ACTIVITY GRANT FUNDING PROGRAM

NASSPDA would like to encourage its members and our community at large to engage in various fun activities that promote same-sex dancing. We recognize that many of our members may have a creative idea and NASSPDA would like to contribute in a small financial way.

Up to 4 grants of \$250 each will be awarded per calendar year on a first-come first-served basis to applicants who can demonstrate that the proposed activity will advance NASSPDA's mission of promoting and expanding social and competitive same-sex partner dancing.

The proposed event should also be in alignment with NASSPDA's following goals:

- * Support functions and venues for social same-sex partner dancing.
- * Provide a resource for same-sex partner dancers.
- * Aim to raise the level of same-sex partner dancing
- * Encourage the inclusion of dancers from diverse backgrounds with regard to race, ethnicity, gender, age, [dis]ability, gender identity and/or expression.

Some ideas for events and organizers to receive grant support:

- Same-sex dance classes
- A social dance mixer with actively inviting and encouraging same-sex dancing or "alternative lead and follow"
- An excursion to a local competition, introducing dancers to the concept
- A welcome party before one of NASSPDA's sanctioned competition
- Setting up a booth at a local street fair promoting same-sex dancing
- A neighborhood or community event promoting partner dancing and the inclusion of same-sex dancing
- Involving studios to promote same-sex dancing
- An event in conjunction with a city's Pride activities
